Paul Reiger commented that County ordinance does not reference tires and he stated that there should be a regulation stipulating how many tires are permitted on a lot. Mr. Reiger also commented that all ordinances should be enforced.

Dan Kramer commented on (1) politicians putting up illegal signs (referencing an article in the Cape Gazette), (2) other sign regulation violations, (3) violations in general and (4) the County's lack of enforcement.

Bayhealth Foundation Presentation Lindsay Rhodenbaugh, President of Bayhealth Foundation, and Mike Metzing, Vice President, Corporate Support Services, Bayhealth Medical Center, were in attendance to give a presentation on Bayhealth's plans to build a new health campus on a 165 acre parcel of land off of Route 1 in Sussex County and the economic impact of this \$300 million project on the County. The new health campus is proposed to open in 2019. Mr.

Rhodenbaugh stated that it is their hope that a portion of the cost of this project will come from the communities in Sussex County and they have set a goal to raise \$15 million of the total cost of the project from philanthropic support from the community. To date, more than \$8.5 million has been committed. Mr. Rhodenbaugh asked that the Sussex County Council consider supporting this project.

Patricia Deptula, Director of Special Projects, reported on the election results for the Pinetown Proposed Streetlighting District. Out of a total of 26 eligible votes, 11 votes were cast; the total number voting in support of the Streetlighting District was 10 and the total number voting in opposition was 1. Ms. Deptula reported that the final count reveals that the property owners are in favor of the project. Ms. Deptula also reported that the Council previously approved the estimated annual billing rate of \$66.20 for the proposed district, contingent on the election of the district. Based on affirmative results of the election and in accordance with Chapter 95 of the Sussex County Code, the Engineering Department recommends that the District be established.
